Committees

UNSC (United Nations Security Council)

The most powerful body in the UN, the UNSC is where the fate of nations is debated. With the power to impose sanctions, authorize force, and deploy peacekeepers, it's the arena for high-stakes diplomacy. It challenges delegates to negotiate under pressure while tackling global crises like wars, nuclear threats, and international terrorism.

NTC (Nuremberg Trials Committee)

The Nuremberg Trials Committee in MUN simulates the historic tribunal held after World War II to prosecute Nazi leaders for war crimes, crimes against humanity, and crimes against peace. Delegates take on roles of judges, prosecutors, and defendants to debate justice, international law, and accountability. This committee challenges participants to balance legal reasoning with moral responsibility, making it one of the most intense and thought-provoking crisis-style committees in MUN.

DISEC (Disarmament and International Security Committee)
